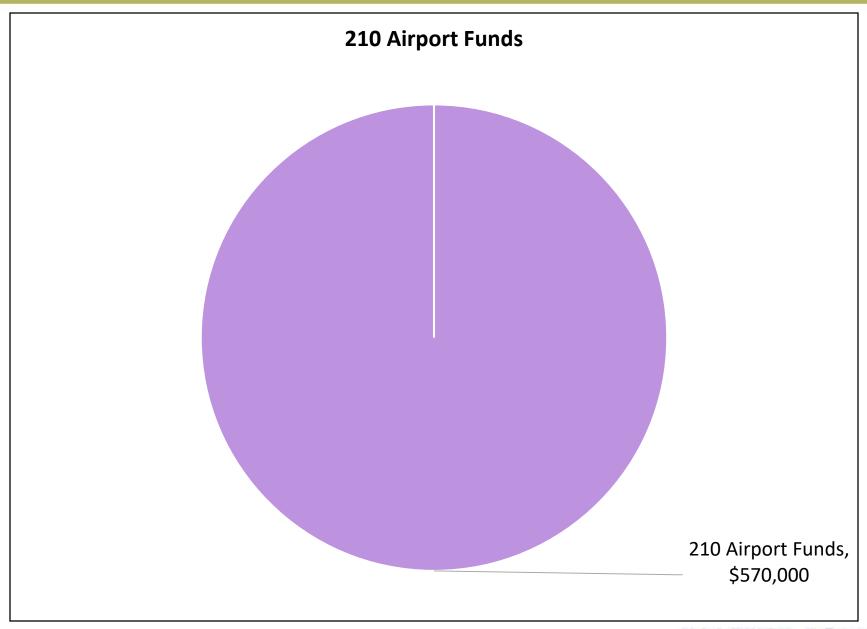


#### Annual Expenditures vs Need

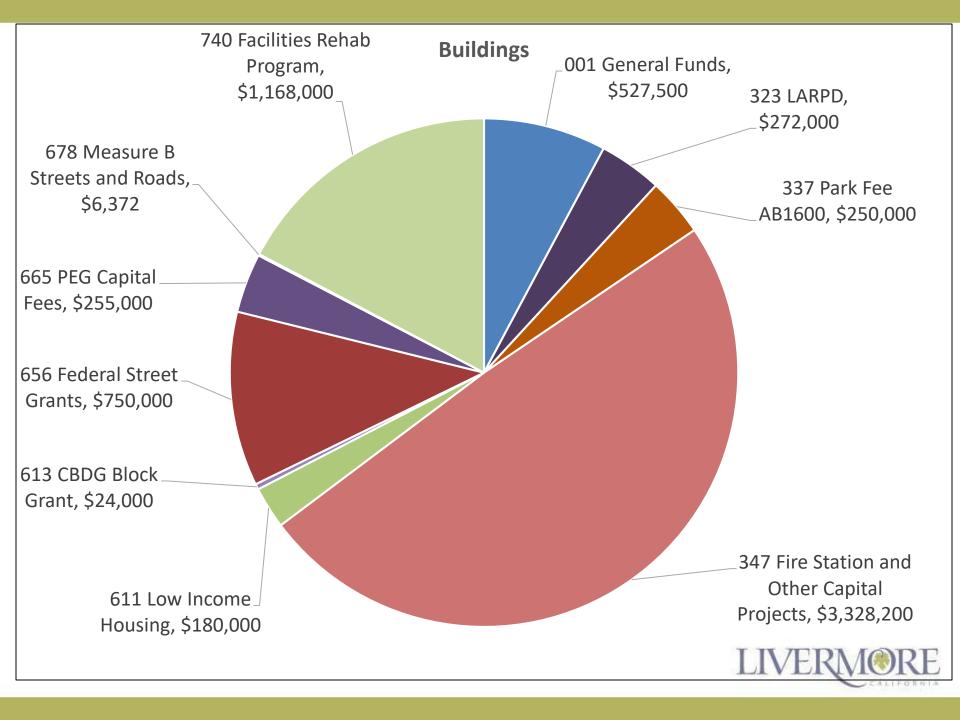


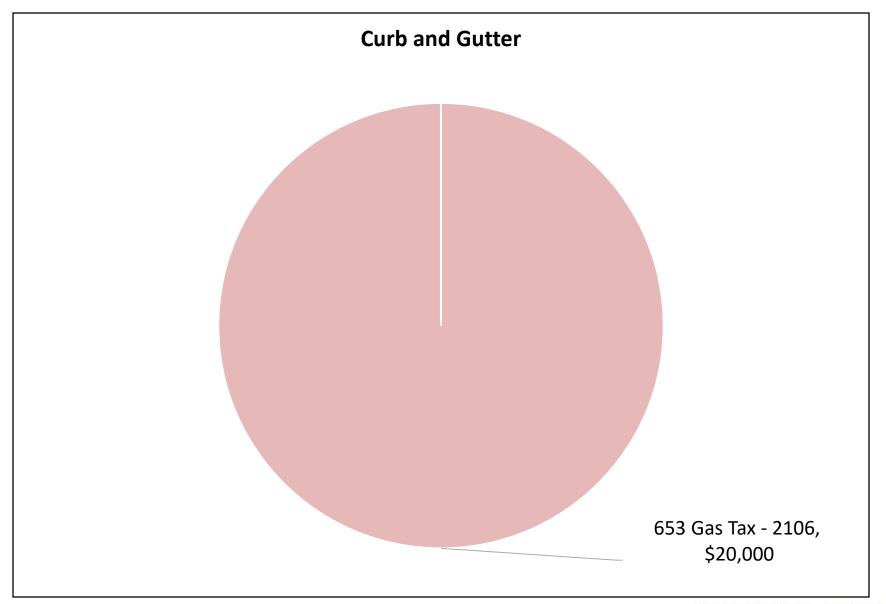

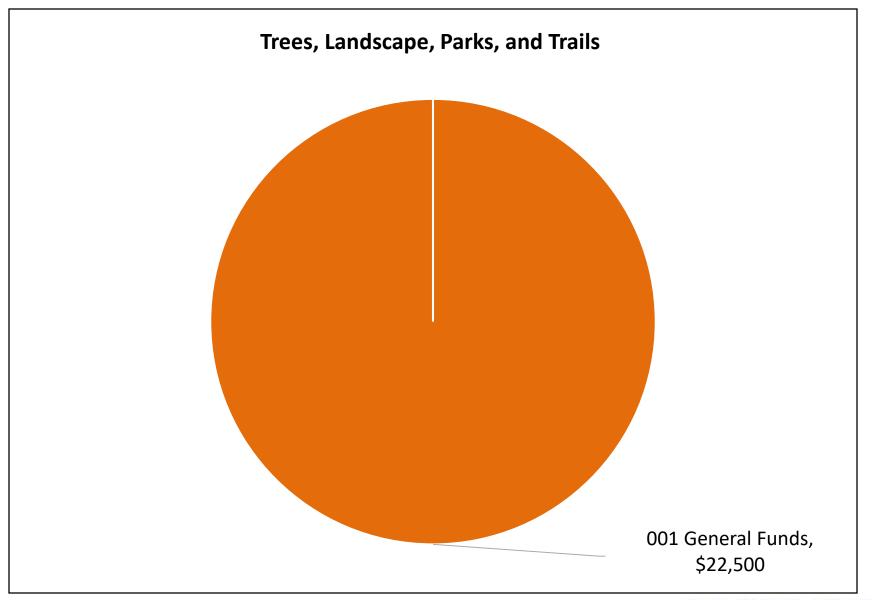




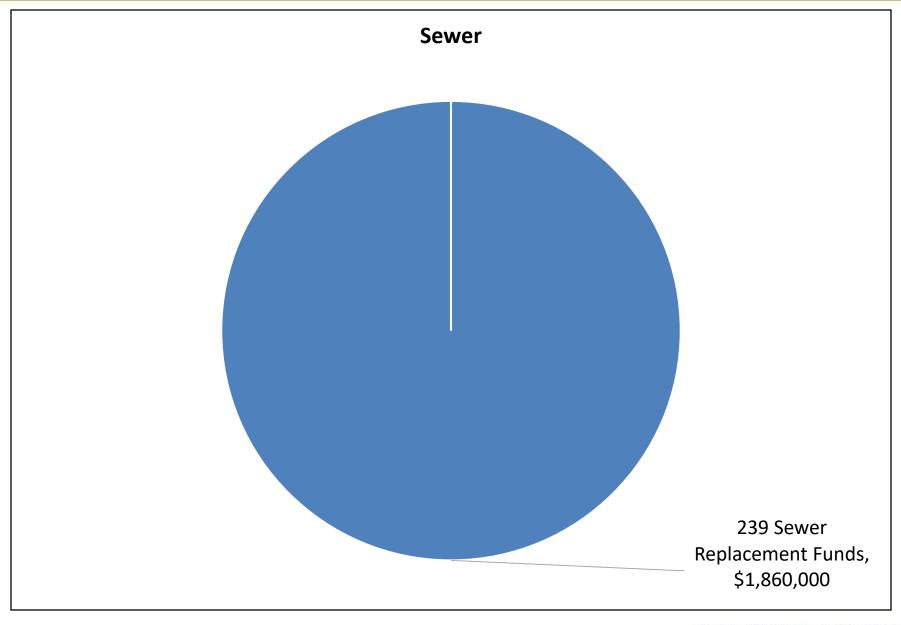




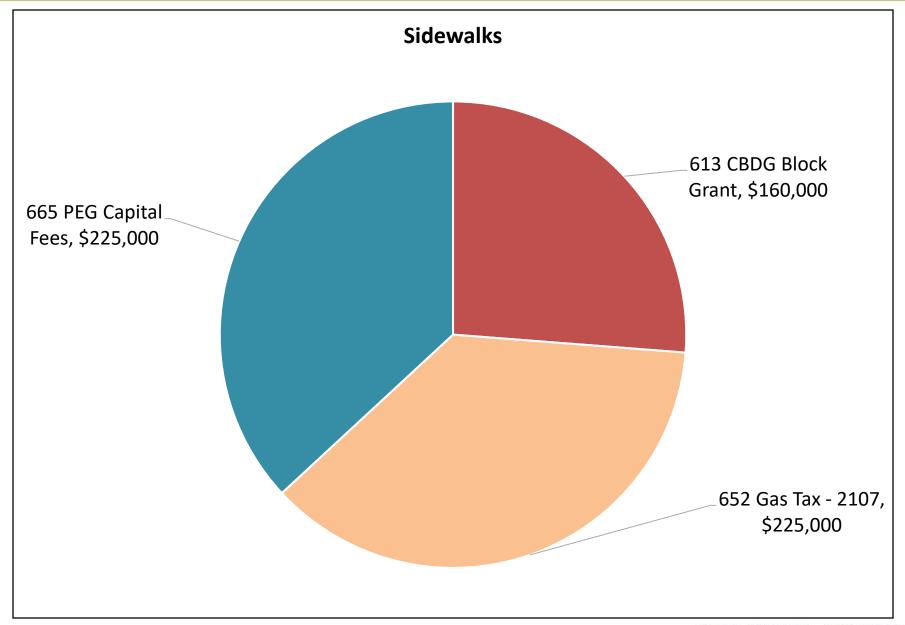




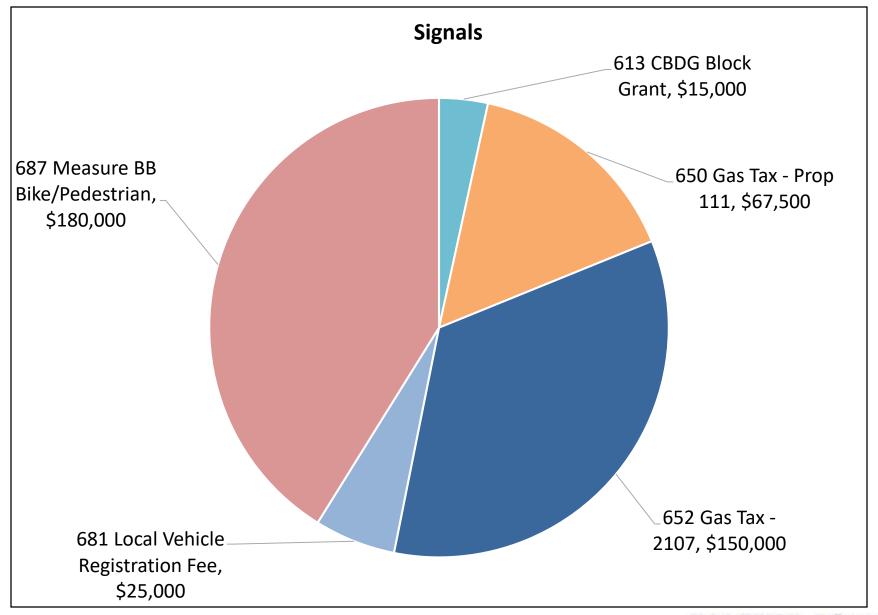




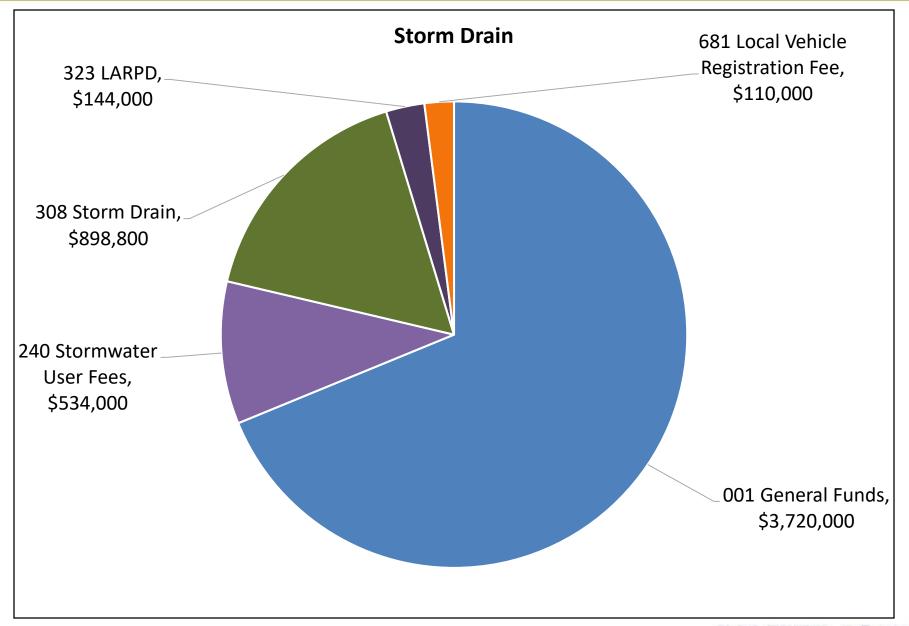




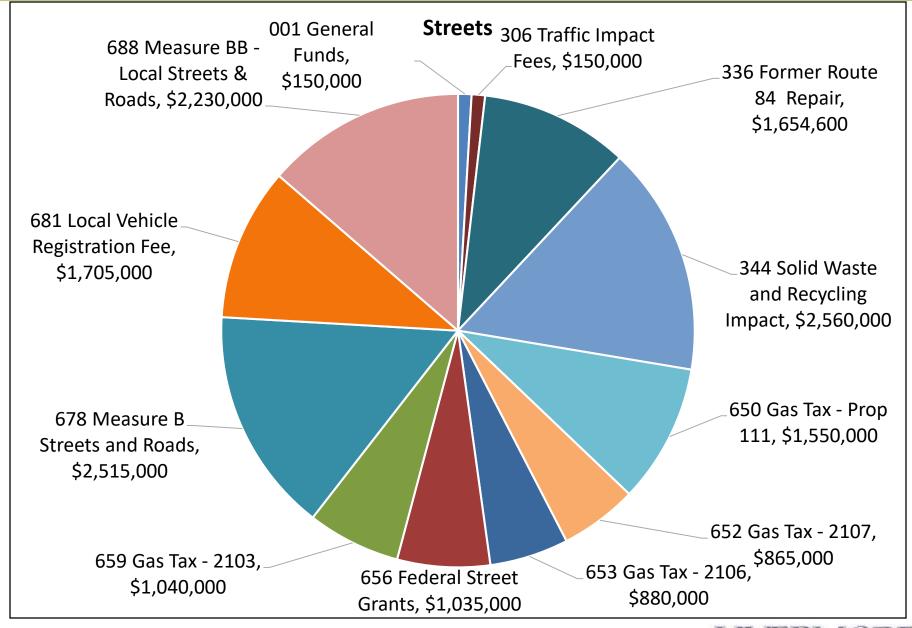




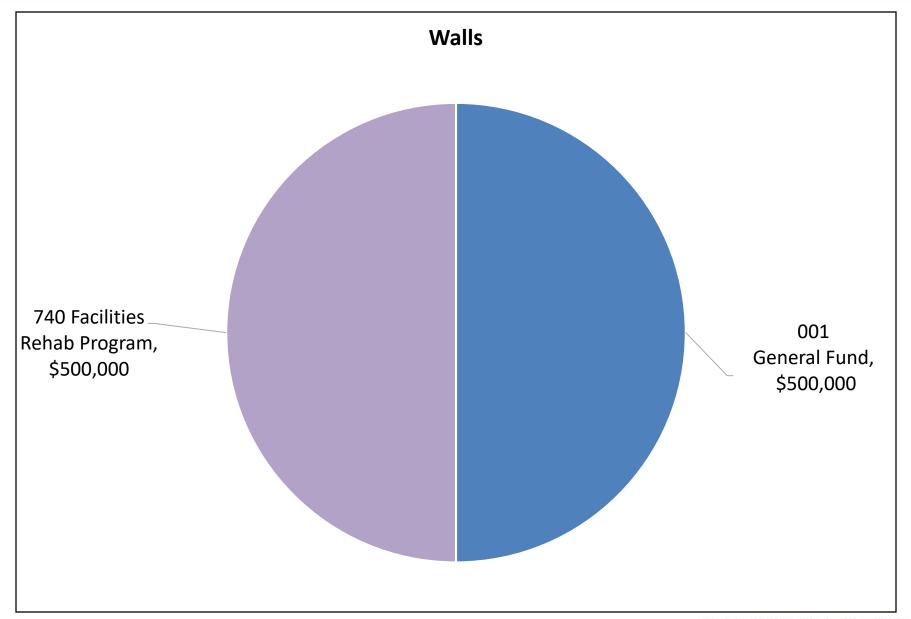




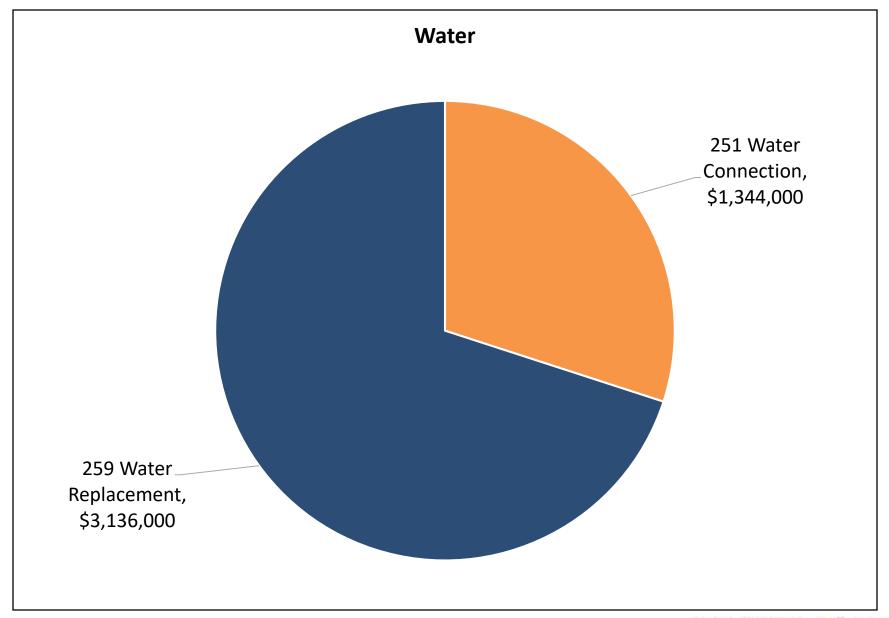




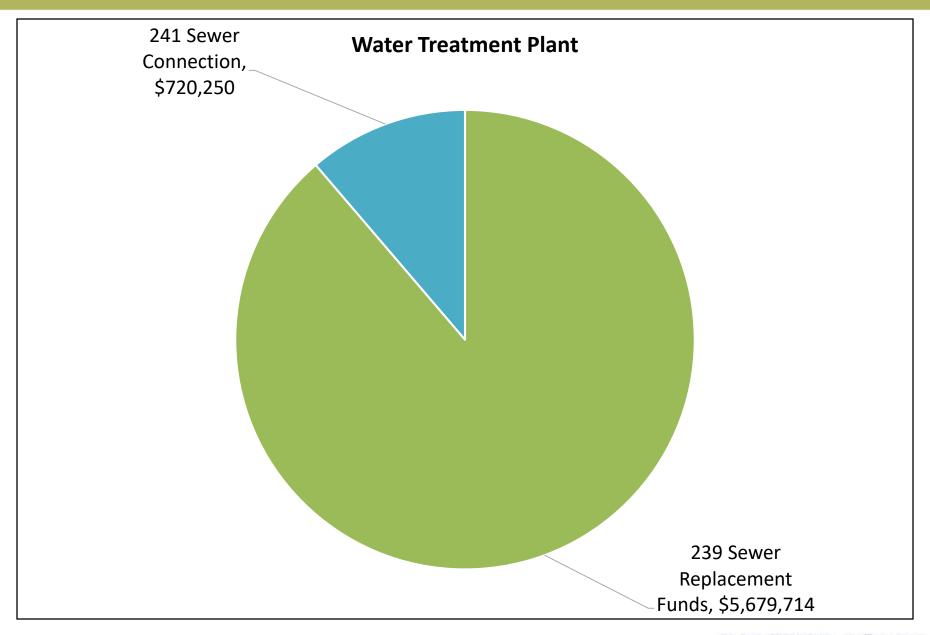














## **Economic Issues Impacting the CIP**

Road Repair and Accountability Act (SB1)—Increased gas tax, vehicle registration fees, etc. resulting in \$1.5 million more for street maintenance

Regional Water Quality Control Board (MRP2.0 Permit) - Added trash capture (\$5.4 million) and green infrastructure requirements (up to \$113 million)

SB 231 - Modifies the definitions for Prop 218 to include Storm Drain Facilities
